### Alison Pickart: Refurbishment of Old Apartment in San Francisco

A full-floor apartment on Vallejo Street in the Pacific Heights, San Francisco, built in 1940, is one of the oldest shared apartments. Although the apartment is very traditional, the couple, as the owner of the apartment, wanted a modern-style interior decoration to reflect their art collection and stunning city views, so they chose local architect Stephen Sutro (with his Famous for modern aesthetics) and interior designer Alison Pickart.



"It is a work of art that sets the tone and direction for the entire project. It is a moonstone and gold fire screen from Come FR. She shared an auction brochure to the meeting, and the client fell in love with it. Any piece of work is It has its own artistic value," Pickart said.



The project was completely rebuilt, and the designer expanded the apartment's existing interior space to the outside, then rebuilt it, poured lightweight concrete floors, and redesigned the floor plan. The apartment's foyer sets the tone for the high finish with hand-polished stucco, with bronze and light gold tones to complement the couple's art collection. The interior design reflects their love of art, as almost every piece of art is placed and placed in a way that is tailored to them.



The living room media center is equipped with an electric TV lift. In creating this "central cube", the first half of the entire apartment was able to open into a huge space so that the couple could enjoy the Golden Bridge, Presidio Bay, Bay Bridge, the city and pier.



Handcrafted details include a custom range hood with handmade coated paper in the kitchen, hand-painted wallpaper in the powder room, custom polished stainless steel works for the main bathroom, and recesses in the ceiling, recessed, and LED lighting to make the entire house All integrated Lutron Homeworks system.





The wall interview in the bathroom uses undulating tiles to simulate the ripples of the water flow and is full of artistic features.
